FACT SHEET

Catholic Health Initiatives is a national nonprofit health care system with headquarters in Denver. The second-largest faith-based health care system in the nation, Catholic Health Initiatives was formed in 1996 through the alliance of four Catholic health systems seeking to strengthen and expand their health ministry for the future. It was the first Catholic system to give lay people a sponsorship role in its facilities. Today, Catholic Health Initiatives provides health care and other services to a diverse mix of 69 urban and rural communities across the nation.

- 75 hospitals, including 22 critical-access facilities and 30 rural hospitals that are the sole providers of health care in their communities
- 40 long-term care, assisted-living and residential facilities; two community health-services organizations
- 19 states: Arkansas, Colorado, Idaho, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Maryland, Minnesota, Nebraska, New Jersey, New Mexico, North Dakota, Ohio, Oregon, Pennsylvania, South Dakota, Tennessee, Washington and Wisconsin.
- 66,000 employees
